What is People 1st accreditation?

People 1st accreditation is a 'stamp of approval' that recognises college and training providers offering exceptional hospitality training. There are two levels of accreditation – gold and silver – and employers and potential students can use the system to find the best training providers in our industry.

Colleges become accredited by undergoing a rigorous assessment process, which includes an application, evidence, verification visits and interviews and a final decision from an independent employer panel.

If a college is already accredited and teaches a specialist area such as patisserie and confectionery or food and beverage service, it can also apply to become a Centre of Excellence. In addition, it can apply to have its restaurant recognised by AA Hotel Services as part of the AA College Rosette scheme.
