HOME BUYER'S CHECKLIST

When out viewing houses use this checklist as a reminder of 'hidden' issues to look out for. Use the list as a place to make comments to follow up on, or to tick off if you are happy with that aspect of the property. These issues don't have to put you off buying the house, but will help give a better idea of what work might be in store once you move in.

Central heating/boiler	Checked	Comments
Is there a regular maintenance and servicing contract for the boiler?		
Look for a date on the servicing sticker or booklet – is this with the last twelve months?	in 🔲	
Note the general appearance of the boiler – if it is dirty or dust it may not have been touched for some time.	у 🗌	
What type of boiler is it? eg wall hung, back boiler		
If there is a hot water cylinder? Is it lagged or insulated?		
Are there any signs of dripping or rust around any of the connections?		
Does the heating work efficiently? Ask to put the heating on a the start of your viewing – by the time you have been round th house the radiators should be getting warm.		
Electrics	Checked	Comments
Check the home consumer unit or fuse box – this will give an indication of when the electrical circuits were last overhauled.		
Check the condition of the sockets – old sockets may suggest the rest of the wiring is not up to date.		
Roof and attic	Checked	Comments
Are there any missing or cracked slates or tiles?		
Are any tiles misaligned or that seem out of place?		
Do the gutters have any holes, do they appear solidly fixed, or are there any drips or blockages?		
Does the chimney stack appear to be straight or are there any visible signs of damage?		
Can you get easy access to the attic space? If there is no ready access, it could indicate that the attic is not checked regularly.		
Are there any damp patches in the attic?		

Alarms	Checked	Comments
If there is a burglar alarm, is it remotely monitored, and does it have a maintenance contract?		
Are there mains connected smoke alarms installed and do they work?		
Is there a carbon monoxide alarm installed?		

Pests	Checked	Comments
Check the attic for any sign of wasps nests – a nest can have the appearance of dried paper.		
Look for teeth marks on boxes or bags in the attic, or other signs of items being nibbled.		
Watch out for droppings – mouse droppings look like brown or black grains of rice.		
Windows	Checked	Comments
If the windows are new, do they have a certificate of installation and a guarantee?		
Do the windows fit snugly in their frames? Any gaps could cause rattling and could also compromise security.		
Check for any misting within double glazed units as this indicates the seal is damaged.		
Check whether the windows which open are lockable, and check whether any have been painted shut.		
Doors	Checked	Comments
Check the locks on all the doors to the property to ensure they meet current security recommendations – particularly back doors and patio doors.		
Do the door and/or window locks have keys, and if so how many sets?		
Radiators	hecked	Comments
Are the valve connections rusty?		
Are there any signs of damp patches under the radiator valves?		
Are there any signs of rust on the radiators themselves?		
Damp (checked	Comments
Look out for patches of damp or mould – whilst these could be a result of a temporary leak, they may indicate something more serious.		
New patches of paint, plaster or strips of wallpaper may be hiding a problem.		
Drains	Checked	Comments
Check outside for smells from any drains – this may indicate that there is a blockage or other problem.		
Check that any drain covers are secure and don't have any cracks.		
If any of the drains for the downpipes from gutters are missing their grates, check to see whether the drains have become clogged with leaves.
