FUEL PRICE REPORT JULY 2013

Just as UK petrol looked as if it may stabilise for the summer at 134.6p a litre, a weaker pound and speculation in the oil and fuel markets are again driving up the pump price. The cost of diesel is also rising, but not as fast.

Oil: \$109 a barrel

Unleaded prices have risen by 1.2ppl from 134.6ppl to 135.8ppl. **Diesel** prices have risen by 1.0ppl from 139.2ppl to 140.2ppl. The price difference between unleaded and diesel has fallen to 4.4ppl.

Northern Ireland recorded the highest price for **unleaded** at 136.6ppl. **London and the North West** recorded the lowest price for **unleaded** at 135.5ppl. **Scotland and East Anglia** recorded the highest **diesel** price at 140.8ppl. **The North West** has the cheapest **diesel** at 139.7ppl.

Supermarket prices for **unleaded** rose by 1.6ppl. The gap between supermarket prices and the UK average for **unleaded** has fallen to 1.6ppl.

The UK has the 11th highest petrol price and the fourth highest diesel price.
